Glassroom Updates

KINDERGARTEN

ELA- We are wrapping up our fourth unit, "Why Do People Tell Stories?" and learning the different types of writing authors use in stories. We've also been learning how the illustrations in any type of story helps the reader understand the story better. Students should be able to identify the characters, setting, as well as the problem and solution in a story. The kindergarteners have been working on building CVC words and focusing on breaking apart words into syllables and then breaking apart those syllables into sounds. For grammar, we are reviewing nouns and verbs and inventing many sentences with nouns and verbs.

Writing- Kindergarten is working diligently on identifying whether or not a given sentence is asking a question or making a statement and also what kind of punctuation is needed for each. The children are also learning how punctuation expresses feelings.

Social Studies–We have recently learned about the history of the Pilgrims and the Native Americans. We have been reviewing months of the year, days of the week, and seasons. The children have been introduced to a calendar and given real world scenarios as to why a calendar is helpful and the order of events. The children will be filling out their own calendar as well and making a countdown to Winter Break chain link.

Math- We recently ended Chapter 4 where we've been comparing numbers within 10. We will begin Chapter 5 where we will begin composing and decomposing numbers up to 10 to help build the concept of addition and subtraction.

Science-

We have recently started our unit on Matter and the properties it entails such as size, shape, color, temperature, weight, and texture. We have been categorizing objects and sharing and listening to the ideas of others which has been helpful in class discussions.

1ST GRADE

ELA-We are learning to read long vowel words with silent e. We are reading nonfiction texts about technology.

Grammar-Students will work with and review proper nouns such as specific people, places, and things. Students will also write simple sentences using subjects and predicates.

Writing-Students will write opinion pieces as a reflection to a text.


Math-Your student will be subtracting with numbers greater than 10. The strategies counting back and using addition to subtract will be used again. The subtraction strategy get to 10 will be introduced to your student as well. The vocabulary words students will review in this chapter are bar model, difference, minus, part-part-whole model, and subtraction equation.

Social Studies-Students will compare life now with life in the past. They will also identify celebrations & national holidays.

Science-Our First graders will be learning about the various ways that objects can move, such as in a straight line, zigzag, back-&-forth, round-&-round, fast & slow.



2ND GRADE



In **writing**, students will begin to focus on personal narratives. They will write a narrative about a personal experience. Students will be writing complete sentences, using transitions, and demonstrating legible print while writing their narratives.

In **math**, students will subtract within 100 using various strategies.

In **science**, we are investigating ways to change matter. Students will be exploring this standard by designing a toy and completing our candy cane common experiment. In **social studies**, students will be using maps and globes to locate our state, hometown, North America, continents, oceans, the equator, prime meridian, and the north and south poles.

3RD GRADE

We have a month full of fun learning as we wrap up 2023! Here is what we are doing in third grade for December:

In **ELA**, we will be reviewing the reading skills we have learned so far this school year with a gingerbread theme!

In **math**, we are continuing to practice our division skills. We will be discussing and learning about multiplication patterns in a table as we get closer to winter break.

In **science**, we are wrapping up our unit on matter and beginning to learn about different types of energy.

In **social studies** students will be working on their economics projects where they create a store to market a product of their choice. We can't wait to see their creativity!

We are also in need of some large outdoor games for our recess time. Some examples would be a jumbo tic tac toe game, outdoor checkers, connect four, and parachutes. If you are able to donate a game, we really appreciate it!

4TH GRADE

Math: Students are learning to understand fraction equivalence and comparison. They will identify and generate equivalent fractions, including

fractions greater than one. Students will describe how the numerator and denominator are affected when the equivalent fraction is created.

Science: Students will compare objects based on observable and measurable physical properties (shape, color, hardness, texture, odor, taste, attraction to magnets, mass, volume). Students will learn about physical and chemical changes, and about the law of conservation of mass.

ELA: Students will use context clues, figurative language, word relationships, reference materials, and/or background knowledge to determine the meaning of multiple- meaning and unknown words and phrases, appropriate to grade level. Students will identify the narrator's point of view and explain the difference between a narrator's point of view and character perspective in a literary text. Students will summarize a text to enhance comprehension and include plot and theme for a literary text.

Social Studies: We are wrapping up our Native Tribes unit with a very special presentation from Jim Sawgrass.

5TH GRADE

We are wrapping up the year with writing! After the holiday break, students will be really preparing for the F.A.S.T. writing test, in April, with a review of each type of writing, and a lot of practice with structure and mechanics! Students have been working on writing skills using transitions in each paragraph when writing a multi-paragraph essay. We are also practicing proofreading skills as we write while using a dictionary and/or thesaurus to build our vocabulary words within our writing. To celebrate the season, we will be doing a persuasive writing piece about a gingerbread house!

Unit 4 in Benchmark Advance is reviewing skills on character and author's perspective, summarizing a story with relevant details, and understanding figurative language in stories and poetry.

Early Explorers unit is ending with individual explorer studies! We researched 9 different explorers, their journey, their findings, and how their discoveries shaped America today!We will be celebrating Holidays Around the World and taking a trip, via short reading passages, to visit various countries and discover how they celebrate the holidays!

In science, we are wrapping up the matter unit. In math, we just finished whole number division and we are now moving into division with decimals.

ELEMENTARY SPECIAL AREA

Elem Art:

Congratulations to Dakota Miller for receiving the Excellence Award at the Deland Fall Festival of the Arts. Her artwork is currently on Exhibition, along with other winners, at Gateway Center for the Arts: The show runs November 30-December 13 at Gateway Center for the Arts - 880 N US Highway 17-92, DeBary - Tues-Fri 10:00am-4:00pm.

Kindergarten is learning about printmaking, line, and value as they create their Sheep. Ist graders are finishing up their Ocean Floor Resist painting where they learned about space, wax resist, watercolor techniques and how to create implied texture in their artwork. They are about to begin their Printed Barns. They will be learning about balance and symmetry, as well as printmaking.

2nd graders are working on their Close-Up Cows. They are learning about balance and symmetry, along with printmaking.

3rd graders are finishing up their Caribbean Sunset. They learned about space and watercolor techniques. They are about to start Monoprint Roosters where they will learn about printmaking, space, and warm and cool colors.

4th and 5th graders are currently painting their Northern Lights artwork. They have been learning about space and implied texture.

Art Club has finished their paper mache' pumpkins and are starting their mixed media project using acrylic paint and air-dry clay.

Elem PE:

We have had some high flying, sensational, and epic catches made for TOUCHDOWNS during our football 1v1 drills. Student athletes are learning to fake out their opponent, create space, and score! We are taking a brief dodgeball break then right back to the field for some more football and fun.

4th/5th Grade are in the process of rehearsing for their showcase performance Movie Mashup! which will be showing in January. More details for costumes and times will be going out in the next week. We're also working on character studies and what comprises a comprehensive character description.

K-3 is learning theatre vocabulary and working on the foundational aspects of theatre. This helped them get ready for their holiday shows with Ms. Holvey.

TSquad will be performing at the Butler Express event on Dec 12th and we're fresh off the success of our visit to the Florida Theatre Conference. At FTC we won the Best in Pantomime award and had two All-Star Castmembers, Samantha Woodward and Lilly Baldwin.

Elem Music:

As we approach the winter break, we wanted to update you on some exciting developments in 7th-grade.

In **English Language Arts**, we are reading the classic tale, "A Christmas Carol" by Charles Dickens. This timeless story is not only a literary masterpiece but also a wonderful opportunity for students to explore themes of generosity and compassion. Also, a friendly reminder that book projects are due no later than December 11th.

In regular **math**, students are working with two-step equations and inequalities. For those in the accelerated math track, the focus will be on transformations. Encourage your students to engage actively in class discussions and seek help if needed.

In **Science**, students have the creative freedom to craft either a skit or a song showing their understanding of the Rock Cycle. Please be aware that the deadline for this project is December 13th. The unit test will be given on December 14th and 15th, right before winter break. Please check gradebook for assignments we are currently working on. You can also access all my content on my website. In **Civics** we will be working on and completing Unit 4: The U.S. Constitution. The Benchmarks taught in Unit 4 are: 1.9, 2.7, 3.3, 3.7, 3.8, & 3.9.
